In the event of an emergency, a call to the EMT is to be placed from the Horse Show Office using a radio or mobile cell phone of the Show Manager / Safety Coordinator. Exhibitors will be asked not to make emergency calls with their cell phones.

The nearest equine surgical facility is Tufts Equine Center 53 Willard St, North Grafton, MA 01536

The closest Emergency Room is Johnson Memorial Medical Center 201 Chestnut Hill Rd Stafford Springs, CT

The address of the show is 247 Hall Hill Rd, Somers, CT 06071. This address shows up on all GPS devices. Main entrance is on Hall Hill Rd and has a large blue sign that says "Shallowbrook Equestrian Center".

In case of an accident:

- 1. Do not move the patient.
- 2. Call for EMT, give ring location.
- 3. Catch the horse
- 4. EMT will evaluate patient and determine status.
- 5. If required, the EMT and show management will call for an ambulance to be dispatched.

Upon notifying Ambulance Dispatch:

- 1. A member of show staff will go to the complex entrance on Hall Hill Rd to direct emergency vehicles to the accident location.
- 2. The Ring Crew is to clear ALL obstacles and make the ring accessible for ambulance-necessary personal only and keep spectators back.
- 3. The Technical Delegate and Medical Personal will complete the USEF Accident/Injury Report Form and submit all forms to USEF.
- 4. The horse show will be on hold until all emergency vehicles have left the showgrounds and staff have resumed activities.
